MDS Update, Your Gifts at Work - The groundbreaking for a new 40-house subdivision in Bloomington, Texas took place last Saturday. The neighborhood is being built for residents whose homes were destroyed by Hurricane Harvey two years ago.

Mennonite Disaster Service is partnering with Samaritan's Purse, the Rebuild Texas Fund, the Rio Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church, and Golden Crescent Habitat for Humanity to bring the project to fruition. Amish volunteers from Disaster Aid Ohio will be serving with MDS to build 30 of the homes.
