When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.'

Peter turned and saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following them; he was the one who had reclined next to Jesus at the supper and had said, 'Lord, who is it that is going to betray you?' When Peter saw him, he said to Jesus, 'Lord, what about him?' Jesus said to him, 'If it is my will that he remains until I come, what is that to you? Follow me!'

Adult Sunday School – This Sunday (and next) at 11 am ET our elders will be facilitating discussions around the idea of *Church Around the Table*--a way of gathering to worship through reading and reflecting on scripture, sharing, prayer, and conversation in smaller groups. It's an experiment on how to *do and be* church together, on Sunday mornings, outside of our building or Zoom.

Elders are proposing we experiment and discover new ways of being church with each other. Experimenting allows us to ask questions we wouldn't necessarily ask otherwise. Let's consider together questions about who we are (identity) and where we want to go as a congregation (purpose). Getting out of our normal routines can be one way of learning more about ourselves and one another.

Church Around the Table is different than small groups. If UMC decides to experiment with this model, everyone will be invited to a group of 10-14 persons, meeting once a month, on a given Sunday, instead of our regular worship service. Come learn more - bring your questions, your hopes, your wonderings.
