

During the pandemic, more than 80 books were added to the UMC library. Below are some new titles with selected reviews to encourage you to visit the library in the basement. Come discover a 'new' classification system and browse new and donated books during the past two years. Here are reviews of just a few.

White picket fences: Turning toward love in a world divided by privilege Amy Julia Becker - Becker guides readers through her growing realization of how inequality has negatively impacted herself and others. "Privilege harms everyone," she writes, "those who are excluded from it and those who benefit from it." Black and white, rich and poor, strong and weak. Winner of Christianity Today's 2018 Book Awards Award of Merit: "Told with grace and humility, this memoir will be a helpful companion to those who are wrestling with similar questions about privilege." -- Ruth Everhart, Christianity Today

Tenacious solidarity: Biblical provocations on race, religion, climate, and the economy — Walter Brueggemann - Brueggemann brings the "transformative potential" of the biblical texts to bear on critical contemporary contexts, including but not limited to economic disparities, racial injustice and white supremacy, climate and care for creation, and the power of memory and mentoring.
