

6 PRINCIPLES OF NONVIOLENCE

- 1. Nonviolence is a way of life for courageous people.
- 2. Nonviolence seeks to win friendship and understanding.
- 3. Nonviolence seeks to defeat injustice, not people.
- 4. Nonviolence holds that unearned, voluntary suffering can educate and transform.
- 5. Nonviolence chooses love instead of hate.
- 6. Nonviolence believes that the universe is on the side of justice.
