Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. Anabaptist Community Bible - Expertly designed using the Common English Bible translation, the Anabaptist Community Bible will connect you more deeply to the biblical story, the anabaptist story, and your own story. More than 7,200 marginal notes alongside the biblical text feature commentary from anabaptist scholars, historical notes from the tradition, and the insights of nearly 600 bible study groups. This pairing of notes and introductions alongside the biblical text commemorates the 500th anniversary of anabaptism by modeling a community-based approach to reading scripture and calling readers to follow Jesus in word and deed. **Pre-orders** are accepted until Oct. 1, 2024. Shipping for less than 12 copies is \$6.99 each or custom shipping for orders of 13 or more bibles. Prices go up an average of \$20/bible after that.
