The next day, John was standing again with two of his disciples. When he saw Jesus walking along, he said, "Look! The Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard what he said, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he asked, "What are you looking for?"

They said, "Rabbi (which is translated teacher), where are you staying?" He replied, "Come and see." So they went and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about 4 o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two disciples who heard what John said and followed Jesus was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. He first found his own brother Simon, and

said to him, "we have found the Messiah" (which is translated Christ). He let him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "you are Simon, son of John. You will be called Cephas (which is translated Peter)."

The next day, Jesus wanted to go into Galilee, and he found Philip. Jesus said to him, "Follow me." Philip was from Bethsaida, the hometown of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law and the Prophets: Jesus, Joseph son, from Nazareth. Nathanael responded, "Can anything from Nazareth be good?" Philip said, "Come and see."
