Children in UMC worship – Children through fifth grade are invited to come to the front of the sanctuary for children's time. Children of all ages are also welcome to remain in the sanctuary for the service or to gather at the table in the back for quiet activities using the materials provided.

Do you have a winter home improvement project planned but are missing an essential tool or maybe several tools? Check out the church's 'Sharing and Loan List' under the Community tab on the Church website. It lists nearly 100 tools and other items that are available for you to borrow.

Please consider supporting Park Forest Preschool families this holiday season. If interested, send donations to the church by Wednesday, December 10th. Write checks to UMC and designate "Preschool Christmas Gift" in the memo. Last year we were able to donate \$50 gift cards to each Park Forest Preschool family – this year we are aiming for \$75. Gift cards allow families to make choices for their holiday celebrations. Park Forest Preschool is a nonprofit, tuition-free school for two-, three-, and four-year-old children from income-qualifying families.

Mennonite Central Committee has a request for bars of bath soap. MCC provides soap to hospitals, orphanages, and refugee camps in countries where soap is expensive or difficult to source. Generally, MCC does not have enough soap to meet these requests, so MCC is asking church groups to help meet these needs. In 2024: 5,117 pounds of bath soap was sent to Malawi, Ukraine, and, Zambia.

For the month of December we invite you to participate in purchasing bars of hand /bath soap for MCC. Bars need to be at least 3oz. and kept in the wrapper. (No powder and no laundry soap is requested). **Please Note:** Food Bank items will not be collected by UMC for the month of December.

Announcements (cont.)

Since 2022, Church World Service - Harrisburg has welcomed over 1,200 refugees from countries including Afghanistan, Pakistan, the DRC, Syria and Guatemala to Pennsylvania. Our church has partnered with CWS-H by bringing refugees to the State College area and in directly supporting the work they do in Harrisburg with volunteers and household good donations.

Beginning last January, CWS-H has had to cut their staff by 80%. Even so, they continue to provide essential programs, such as food pantry, job search and legal support, and case management, to 500 refugees who arrived within the past year. Currently, CWS-H is in critical need of funds to keep operating in 2026. They have put out a broad appeal to raise the \$400,000 needed to continue their refugee program.

The UMC leadership team discussed this request and has decided to do a one-time fund-raising effort. If you want to support this cause, you can put a check in offering basket or send one to Jim Rosenberger, designating CWS-H in the memo line. We will collect donations until the first week in December, when a check will be sent from UMC.
